

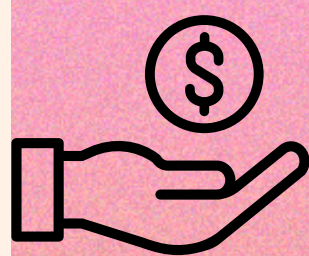
ECONOMIC ABUSE

IN INTIMATE PARTNER RELATIONSHIPS

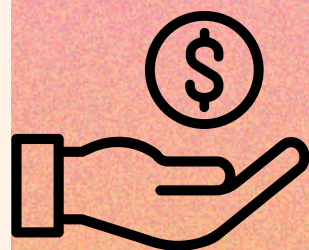


Economic Abuse is a form of Intimate Partner Violence where the abuser uses tactics to control their partner's ability to acquire, use or maintain economic resources

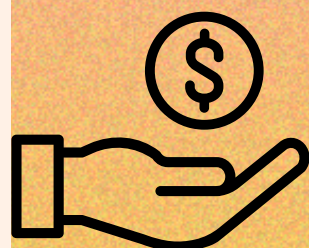
Economic Abuse in a relationship can look like:



Your partner convinces you to loan them money and they don't pay it back



Your partner decides how you should spend your money



Your partner harrasses you at work, causing you to lose your job



Your partner destroys your personal property and leaves you to foot the bill

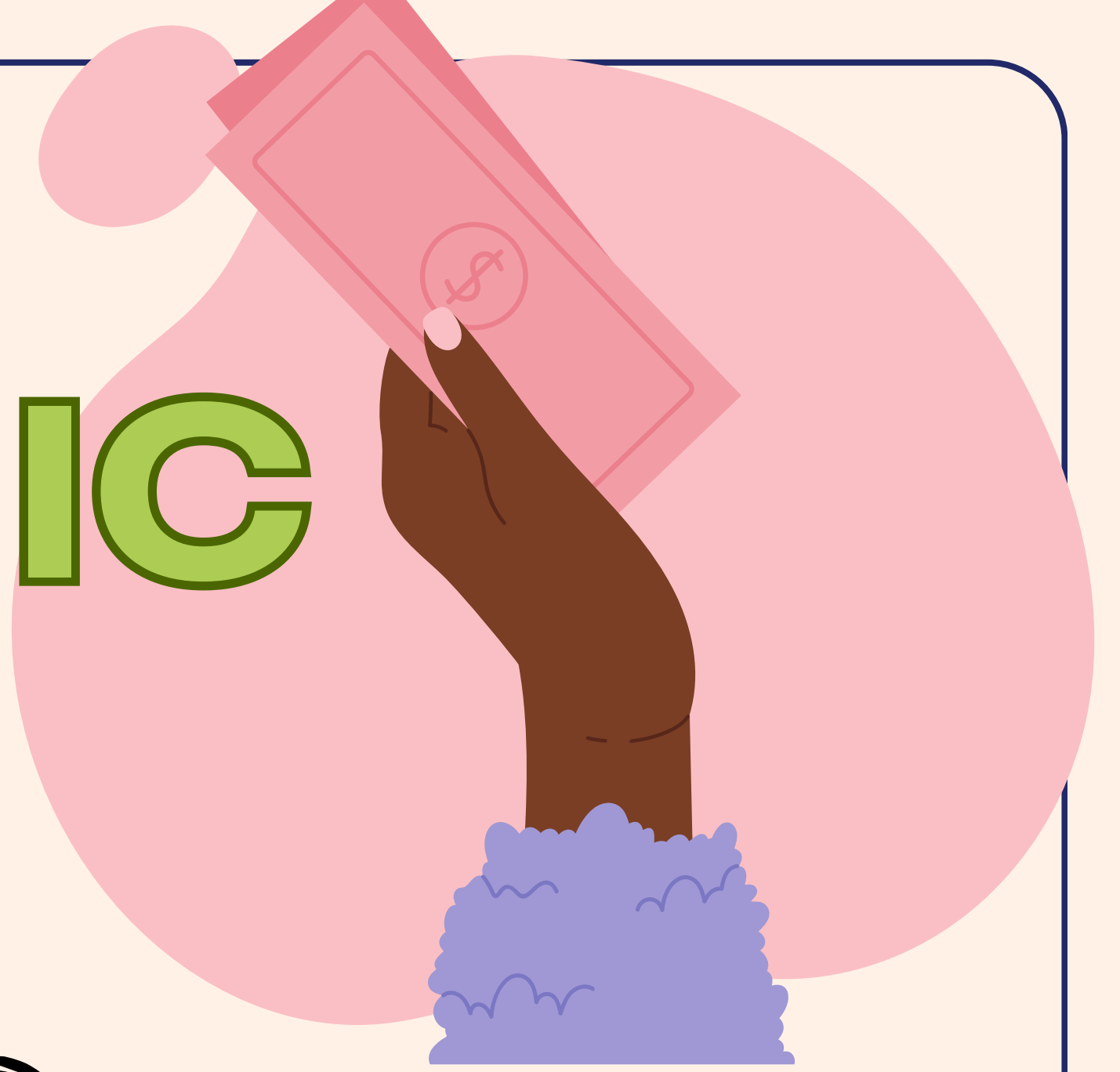
