Access to child savings account leads to asset building among low-income families



Caregivers less likely to enroll to CSA if they don't understand how it works

Local agencies (i.e., schools) are seen as legitimate and trustworthy

What does the Research Say?

Initial monetary investment may encourage more families to enroll to CSA

Caregivers less likely to enroll to CSA if there is mistrust





Some caregivers may need additional outreach to learn about CSA and support in enrolling


GAPS IN THE RESEARCH



Lack of research in community-based outreach efforts to connect child savings account programs with targeted populations

Trusted local agencies in communities have not been a key focus in current research

CalKIDS




- Launched in 2022 by the State of California to make it easier for more children to save for their future education
 - Opportunity L.A. is another similar program based in LA, launched in 2021



• Offers newborns and eligible low-income public school children in California with an initial seed deposit (with other potential financial incentives)

IDEAS FOR FUTURE IMPLEMENTATION

"CalKids should allocate funds to hire trained employees to different campuses to present in classrooms and teach students to create and register their accounts.




